Gordon Brown play returns to the Capital

A SMASH-HIT political play about the rise and fall of former prime minister Gordon Brown is returning to the Capital.

The Confessions of Gordon Brown has sold out the West End and the Fringe but now returns to Edinburgh for a four-night run at the Traverse Theatre.

production stars West Lothian actor Billy Hartman – best known from his long-running role as Terry Woods in Emmerdale – who portrays the former prime minister in a series of monologues that “hilariously exposes the darkest secrets” of the country’s top job.

After graduating from Queen Margaret Drama School,

Hartman played on the London stage in a number of well-known roles such as Bill Sykes in Oliver at Sadler’s Wells Theatre and Isaac Talentire in the original West End production of Howard Goodall’s award-winning musical, The Hired Man.
